A diagnosis of haemophilia in you or your child can be a traumatic experience as your knowledge of haemophilia may be very limited or rooted in a past reality, where adequate and safe treatment was not available.

This results in people bleeding for a longer time after an injury, easy bruising, and an increased risk of bleeding inside joints or the brain. Those with a mild case of the disease may have symptoms only after an accident or during surgery.

Living with haemophilia - Haemophilia Foundation Australia Hsemophilia Haemophilia is a rare and serious X-chromosome linked congenital bleeding disorder that affects the blood's ability to clot, meaning that people with haemophilia bleed for a longer time than normal. It is estimated that about 1 in 10,000 people are affected by haemophilia, with 450,000 people living with haemophilia worldwide.

Haemophilia - Novo Nordisk Haemophilia is caused by an inherited change to a gene. It mainly affects males. How the mutation is inherited. The gene change is on the X chromosome. It can be carried by either the mother or father, or both. The chances of a child inheriting the haemophilia changed gene depends on which of their parents has the changed gene.
